Conditions

To be ridden side saddle by ladies in hunting costume. For horses 148cms and over, riders must have reached their 14th birthday by 1st January of current year. The rider's ability and turnout and the way of going, manners and movement of the horse will be considered as part of the adjudication. The class shall be judged as an overall picture of elegance presented by rider and the horse. Each rider shall give a short individual show which should include walk, trot, canter and extended canter. The class shall be judged from the ground (No ride judge). Side Saddle Ireland rosettes will be presented in the class. A Best Rider rosette sponsored by Equestrian Portable Showers Ireland will be presented to the "Best Rider" among the members. A "Best Turned Out" rosette sponsored by Carr & Day & Martin will be presented to the best turned out combination. Points for the Side Saddle Ireland Ladies and Intermediate National Championship sponsored by Carr & Day & Martin can be earned in this class. Participants must be members of Side Saddle Ireland on the date of the show and must register their participation in the league (free of charge) on itsplainsailing.com/org/ssi to enable the committee to keep a tally of points

Class 6 – Riding Horse- Large & Small Riding Horses.

Class 7- Race Horse to Riding Class (NOVICE) kindly sponsored by Nicholas Dwane, Auctioneer & Valuer confined to Thoroughbred horses that have raced in a Point to Point or on a Racetrack and are registered with their relevant studbook. For horses 4 year old and over, mares and geldings, any height. Riders must be 16 years on 1 January of current year. A Novice is a horse in it's first two years of affiliated competition (**See Note**) and has NOT won a Racehorse to Riding Horse class prior to this season's competition. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle only with a plain cavesson noseband. Novice horses will not be required to gallop. The Judge will NOT ride Novice horses, but will request a short individual show, as defined by the Judge(s).

Horses that have won a Racehorse to Riding class in previous seasons **MUST** compete in the Open class. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Riders will be asked to extend the canter within the class. Horses to be ridden by the Judge. THIS CLASS IS NOT A QUALIFIER

Horses must not have accumulated more than 15pts under SJI or Eventing Ireland rules up to date of show. Class open to registered and un-registered horses. **Points:** Phase 1-Jumping 30 points, Style 10 points, Phase 2- Ride 30 points, Conformation and action in hand 30 points. Total 100 points

Foals qualified for final are not eligible to enter any other class at the show where the final is held.

The Qualifying Exhibitor must fill out their own Qualifying Card at each Qualifying Show.

Class 27 – Broodmare and Foal Team Qualifier – THE Irish Shows Association and Iverk Show Society present The All Ireland Broodmare and Foal Team Championship.

Rules and Conditions

Entries are confined to registered non-thoroughbred broodmares with foal at foot

Each mare and her foal will be judged as a unit: 60% for the mare and 40% for the foal
The competition is open to animals registered in a World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses (WBFSH) studbook or a Department of Agriculture Food and Marine (DAFM) approved studbook with recorded breeding

The mare's passport will be inspected before judging commences. Exhibitors failing to produce a passport will be debarred from competing

Qualified mares may not compete in other classes at Iverk show

Foals are eligible to compete in the foal classes at Iverk Show

Foals must be led at all times

The qualifying exhibitor must fill out their own Qualifying Card at each qualifying show

Class 28 – Bantry Show Society present the KWD I.D. Foal Munster Championship qualifier.

Final : Bantry Show 17th August

Rules and Conditions

The aim of this Championship is to encourage the breeding of Irish Draught foals.

The Championship is open to all foals eligible for ID Class 1 status.

Two foals to be selected at each qualifier at the discretion of the Judges

The Dam's passport must be produced for inspection at the qualifying rounds and at the Final.

The foal passport must be produced at the final.

One of the Judges at the qualifying Show to be from the Irish Draught Horse Judges panel, if possible.

Foals competing at the final are ineligible to enter any other class at Bantry show

There will be separate classes for colt foals and filly foals at the final.

The Overall Champion will be selected from the winners of each class.

The Qualifying Exhibitor must fill out their own Qualifying Card at each Qualifying Show.

These rules should be read in conjunction with the I.S.A Rules.

Class 29- Mare, four year old and over, Stinted. ***This Class is funded by the Breeding Grant Initiative, under National Breeding Services with thanks to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine, and delivered by Horse Sport Ireland.*** The class is open to Studbook registered Mares with recorded breeding. Mares holding a **NON Studbook Passport (White Book)** with pedigree recorded are **NOT** eligible to compete.

Breeder Prize: Breeder of Winning Mare receives **€65**

Irish Pony Society Rules (I.P.S)

All pony classes at Shows affiliated to the I.P.S. shall be carried out and judged in accordance with the Society's Regulations, Rules, and Bye Laws.

No rider under 5 years on January 1st of current year may compete in any class with the exception of the Lead Rein Classes for which the minimum age is 3 years on January 1st of current year.

The 1st & 2nd placed competitors in Classes **31 to 36** qualify for the **IPS Summer Championships in Killossery on July 17th.**

Competitors must be IPS members and ponies registered with the Irish Pony Society prior to championships to be eligible to compete

Class 32 - Open 153cms Show Hunter Pony -

For ponies, mares or geldings; 4 years old and over, exceeding 143cms, but not exceeding 153cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 20th birthday on January 1st of current year.

Entry Fee: €15 1st €60 2nd €25 3rd €15

Class 33 - Open 143cms Show Hunter Pony

For ponies, mares or geldings; 4 years old and over, exceeding 133cms but not exceeding 143cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 17th birthday on January 1st of current year

Class 34 - Open 133cms Show Hunter Pony

For ponies, mares or geldings; 4 years old and over, exceeding 123cms, but not exceeding 133cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 14th birthday on January 1st of current year

Ita Carroll Cup presented by the Carroll family to the Champion Show Hunter Pony in Classes **32 to 34**

Class 35- Open Show Starter Stakes

For open and novice ponies; 4 years old and over, exceeding 123cms but not exceeding 133cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 12th birthday on January 1st of current year.

Class 36 - Open Show Hunter Pony First Ridden

For ponies, mares or geldings; 4 years old and over, not exceeding 123cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 10th birthday on January 1st of current year. The same combination of pony and rider cannot compete in any class for ponies exceeding 123cms at the same show on the same day.

Class 37 - Open Show Hunter Lead Rein Class

For ponies, mares or geldings; 4 years old and over, not exceeding 123cms. Suitable for and to be ridden by riders who have not attained their 8th birthday on January 1st of current year. All ponies must be ridden astride. Riders in this class may not compete in any other class at the same show on the same day, with the exception of any other Lead Rein or First Ridden Class.

Class 38 – Leading Rein Class confined to Co. Waterford
